IV. EXTENSION ACTIVITY

1. Karshakamithra - Community Extension Programme

The Postgraduate and Research Department of Botany, St. Thomas College, Kozhencherry has been consistently interacted with the society, especially to make awareness on the scientific knowledge for solving the problems of farmers and weaker sections of the society. On 15th of July 2021, 'Karshakamithra' an extension activity was organized by the department of Botany as a joint venture with the Central Integrated Pest Management Centre (CIPMC), Ernakulam. CIPMC, Ernakulam is a wing under Directorate of Plant Protection, Quarantine & Storage, Department of Agriculture, Cooperation & Farmers Welfare, Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare, Government of India. Due to Covid '19 pandemic protocol of Govt. of Kerala, only 15 pre-registered farmers were allowed to participate in the program.

The first technical session was led by Mr. Milu Mathews, Plant Protection Officer, CIPMC, Ernakulam, in which the facts, figures and the milestones in the IPM were discussed. The second session was on the problems caused by overuse of herbicides and pesticides in Agriculture sector by Mr. Tom Cherian, Asst. Plant Protection Officer, CIPMC, Ernakulam.

Exhibition of IPM Materials

A small exhibition was arranged by the CIPMC team for the farmers. Different kinds of pest traps, handbooks on agriculture, eggs of *Trichogramma* fly, different pests and their stages, *Pseudomonas, Trichoderma*, sprayers, gum boots etc. were exhibited in the exhibition. Certificates were distributed to participating farmers by Dr. Leena Abraham (HoD of Botany, St. Thomas College, Kozhecherry). Handbooks on agriculture, eggs of Trichogramma, sprayers, gum boots etc. were also distributed to farmers free of cost.

2. Vegetos - 2022

The Postgraduate and Research Department of Botany, St. Thomas College, Kozhencherry has been consistently interacting with the society, especially to make awareness on the scientific knowledge for solving problems of farmers and weaker sections of the society. On 25th of March 2022, 'Vegetos 2022' an extension activity of the department of Botany was conducted in association with IQAC of the college and Spices Board, Kochi. The programme was intended to offer services for the benefit of the farmers in Pathanamthitta District who were engaged in cultivation and trade of spices. Spices Board, Kochi is a wing under Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Government of India. Dr. Joji Mathew, Deputy Director, Spices Board, Kochi discussed the benefits of spices cultivation, entrepreneurship, and post-harvest technology with special emphasis on commercial cultivation and production development. 97 students and 7 teachers of the department of Botany were involved in the programme.

Exhibition and Sales of Spices, Spices Products, Vegetables and Underutilized Crops

A small exhibition was also conducted by the Spices Board team for the farmers and students. Different kinds of spices, their products, value added products etc. were exhibited in one stall. Another stall of home-grown vegetables and under-utilized crops by students was also arranged. Sale of the products to the public and stake holders of the college was also done. Handbooks on spices, tumeric powder, turmeric milk, cream etc. were also distributed to farmers and students at free of cost by spices board.

BRIDGE COURSE SYLLABUS

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

Chemistry Department offers a Bridge course for newly admitted students is conducted every year before the commencement of first semester classes of first year students immediately after their admission in the college. The main objective of this course is to bridge the gap between subject areas studied at pre-university level and areas they would be studying in Graduation. It also helps the students to know before they can start the advanced courses in the college level and what they are actually aware of in the intermediate level. Consequently, after the completion of the **20 hour** bridge course, they will get awareness about the basic and advanced concepts in Chemistry. It also gives an idea about the opportunities, carriers and higher education in chemistry.

The bridge courses will cover typical weaknesses of students in science at the 10th and +2 level. The modules in Chemistry are prepared by keeping in mind that an hour of discussion will bring all the students in the same stage such that they can cope up with the courses in their college level, that requires the concepts of different topics in Chemistry. The modules are made as interactive sessions between the students and the instructors. Furthermore, we have discussed those topics which are harder to understand. At the end of the discussion, teacher may conduct examinations to understand how much the students followed the class. We also conduct entry level tests to know the student knowledge level.

Student Learning Outcomes

This course helps to bridge the students and create and refresh their ideas and knowledge. Students will demonstrate the ability to make scientific predictions of natural phenomena using chemical concepts learned in theory and lab (Critical Thinking Skills). They will develop skills in collecting and managing data in order to express their results in a precise and reliable quantitative or qualitative manner (Empirical and Quantitative Skills, Communication Skills). They will apply chemical concepts to draw logical conclusions about the applicability of data to real-world problems (Critical Thinking Skills). They will use collected data to calculate physical or chemical quantities germane to the experiment being performed (Empirical and Quantitative Skills). They will develop teamwork skills that include not only the efficient acquisition of experimental data, but also the awareness of safety in the laboratory setting (Teamwork).

Syllabus

1. Opportunities & Higher Education in Chemistry(1hr)

Insights to competitive examinations in Chemistry, Government and non-government jobs after Chemistry course

2. Chemistry In Every Day Life & Environmental Science(1hr)

Environmental pollution – Air, water and soil pollution, chemical reactions in atmosphere, ozone and its reactions, greenhouse effect and global warming. Chemicals in medicines – analgesics,

tranquilizers, antiseptics, disinfectants, antimicrobials, antifertility drugs, antibiotics, antacids, antihistamines. Chemicals in food – preservatives, artificial sweetening agents, cleansing agents – soaps and detergents, cleansing action. Green chemistry- Introduction. Green solvents

3. Some Basic Concepts of Chemistry (2hr)

General Introduction: Importance and scope of chemistry, nature of matter, laws of chemical combination. Atomic structure: Dalton's atomic theory: concept of elements, atoms and molecules. Atomic and molecular masses, mole concept. Discovery of electron, proton and neutron. Thompson's model and its limitations, Rutherford's model and its limitations, Bohr's model, de Broglie's relationship, Heisenberg uncertainty principle, concept of orbitals, quantum numbers, shapes of s, p and d orbitals, rules for filling electrons in orbitals.

4. Periodic Properties, chemical bonds & States of Matter (2hr)

Classification of periodic table, modern periodic law and the present form of periodic table, periodic trends in properties of elements. Different types of bonds, VB,MO & VSEPR theory. Three states of matter, intermolecular interactions, types of bonding, Boyle's law, Charle's law, Gay Lussac's law, Avogadro's law, Ideal and Real behaviour, Vapour pressure, viscosity and surface tension.

5. Thermodynamics & Equilibrium (2hr):

Concepts of system, types of systems, surroundings, work, heat, energy, extensive and intensive properties, state functions. First law of thermodynamics – internal energy and enthalpy, heat capacity and specific heat, measurement of ΔU and ΔH , Hess's law of constant heat summation. Second law of thermodynamics, Gibb's energy Third law of thermodynamics.

6. s, p, d and f- Block Elements(1hr):

Group 1 and Group 2 elements: General introduction, electronic configuration, occurrence. diagonal relationship, trends in the variation of properties General Introduction to p-Block Elements Group 13-18 elements: General introduction, electronic configuration, occurrence, variation of properties, oxidation states, trends in chemical reactivity, anomalous properties. Lanthanoids -Actinoids

7. Solid State & Surface Chemistry (2hr)

Classification of solids based on different binding forces: molecular, ionic covalent and metallic solids, amorphous and crystalline solids, unit cell, packing efficiency, voids, number of atoms per unit cell, point defects, electrical and magnetic properties. Metallic, semiconductors and insulators.

Adsorption – physisorption and chemisorption; catalysis: enzyme catalysis; colloidal state: distinction between true solutions, colloids and suspensions; lyophilic, lyophobic

8. Coordination Compounds (1hr)

Coordination compounds: Introduction, ligands, coordination number, colour, magnetic properties and shapes, IUPAC nomenclature of mononuclear coordination compounds, bonding, Werner's theory, VB theory, CFT; isomerism.

9. Organic Chemistry-Basic Principles(1hr):

General introduction, classification and IUPAC nomenclature of organic compounds. inductive effect, electrometric effect, resonance and hyper conjugation.

10. Classification of Hydrocarbons(1hr)

Aliphatic Hydrocarbons: isomerism, physical properties, methods of preparation; Aromatic hydrocarbons – Introduction, IUPAC nomenclature; Benzene: resonance. Haloalkanes and Haloarenes Alcohols, Phenols and Ethers Aldehydes, Ketones and Carboxylic Acids Organic Compounds Containing Nitrogen

11. Organic chemical reactions (1hr)

Reaction intermediates in organic chemistry, free radicals, carbocations, carbanions; 12addition of hydrogen, halogen, water, hydrogen halides (Markovnikov's addition and peroxide effect), hydrogen, halogens, hydrogen halides and water.

12.Biomolecules(2hr)

Carbohydrates - Classification (aldoses and ketoses), monosaccharide (glucose and fructose), D-L configuration, oligosaccharides (sucrose, lactose, maltose), polysaccharides (starch, cellulose, glycogen): importance. Proteins - amino acids, proteins, primary structure, secondary structure, tertiary structure and quaternary structure, denaturation of proteins; enzymes. Hormones -Elementary idea Vitamins - Classification and functions. Nucleic Acids: DNA and RNA

12. Polymers(1hr)

1. Association- detailed report with dates and nature of activity

Invited Talk on Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel: The Unifier of Modern India

Resource person: Dr Harikrishnan S, Assistant Professor and Head of the Department of History at Mahatma Gandhi College, Thiruvananthapuram

The Department of History organised an Invited Talk on 'Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel: The Unifier of Modern India' on 30th October 2021 at 11:30 AM to observe the 'Rashtriya Ekta Diwas' (National Unity Day) which is celebrated on 31st October as a tribute to the legacy of this great man. The resource person for the occasion was Dr. Harikrishnan S, Assistant Professor and Head of the Department of History at Mahatma Gandhi College, Thiruvananthapuram. It was an informative and comprehensive talk which highlighted the life and achievements of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, whose contributions to the making of modern India is second to none. Dr Harikrishnan spoke about the significant role played by Patel in the political unity of India and his deep commitment to the national integration of the country.

The Department of History also sought to provide a platform for scholars and historians to offer an insight into the environmental and cultural dimensions of river Pamba, which flows across the Kozhencherry taluk where St. Thomas College is located. For this, the Department organised a Four Day National Workshop on River Pamba: Environmental Dimensions and Cultural Legacy on 17th, 18th, 19th and 20th March 2022. The program was conducted in hybrid mode as the sessions on Day 1, 2 and 3 were held in online format and Day 4 was conducted in offline mode at Juhanon Mar Thoma Hall.

The Four Day Workshop commenced on 17th March, 2022 with the Inaugural Session presided by the Principal Dr. Roy George K, followed by a session on Megalithic Culture of Pamba River Basin by Dr. Ambily C.S., Assistant Archaeologist, Archaeological Survey of India, New Delhi. Her session was a comprehensive study on the distribution of Megalithic sites on the Pamba River Basin, the material remains excavated from these regions, the source and technique of extracting raw materials by the Megalithic people and the types of burial sites found on this river basin.

The Day 2 of the Workshop which was held on 18th March, 2022 began with a session by **Dr. M.G Sasibhooshan**, a renowned Orator, Writer, Art Historian, & Consultant in Indology on the theme Archaeology of Pamba River Basin. Dr Sasibhooshan began by stating the lack of archaeological excavations in Kerala compared to other states and argued that important excavations took place in the period of colonial rule. He also pointed that there has been a dearth of archaeological excavations in the Pamba and Periyar river basins and mentioned about the artefacts found at Aramula. Dr. Sasibhooshan also narrated his voyage through the Pamba river basin as he visited various places of historical importance.

This session was followed by Environmental History of the Pamba River Basin by Dr. Arun Sasi, Coordinator, Forest Plus 2.0, U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID), New Delhi. Dr Sasi's session assessed the impact of colonial policies on the Pamba River Basin and his study was based on colonial records. He also discussed the establishment and history of Travancore Forest Department and examined the adverse impact of 'reserve forests' on the indigenous communities.

On Day 3, the session was led by **Dr Anitha V**, **Professor and Head, Department of Economics, University of Kerala, Thiruvananthapuram** whose presentation was on 'Sabarimala 'Season' and the Conservation of Pamba River. It focused specifically on the problems faced by Pamba especially during the months of November to February (Sabarimala season). It sought to apply a methodology in order to bring about improvement in the condition of the river by involving the stakeholders. She also tried to address the issue of the impact of increase in footfall of people on the ecology of the region.

The Day 4 held on 21st March 2022 was conducted in offline mode at Juhanon Mar Thoma Hall. The day began with a presentation on Aranmula Snakeboat Race: Antiquity and historical Evolutions by Mr. Amrit Raj, Author, Editor and Local Historian. He spoke extensively

about the naval heritage of India and the recorded history of the Aranmula snakeboat race in the last two centuries. He questioned the historicity of the myths about the origin of the boat race and tried to place it in the larger maritime traditions of Kerala. This was followed by a session on River Pamba: Tourism Opportunities by Mr. Satheesh Miranda, Secretary, District Tourism Promotion Council, Pathanamthitta in which he discussed the various opportunities provided by the Pamba river for the tourism sector.

The last session of the workshop was on Bio-treasures on the Pamba River bank: Vegetation linked to Culture and Environment Protection by **Dr. Anju V Jalaj, Assistant Professor, Department of Botany, St. Thomas College, Kozhencherry.** Dr Jalaj focused on the rich herbal wealth of the Pamba river basin and established a close link between the vegetation and the culture of the endogenous people of the area. She argued that the protection of plants was essential for keeping the tradition, culture and existence of indigenous people. She concluded by highlighting the importance of programs like Citizen Science in order to study the culture in detail and facilitate the protection of vegetation as well as preserve the culture.

REPORT OF REMEDIAL CLASS

During Academic Year 2021-22, the total hours of remedial classes conducted was fifty (odd semester-25 hours & even semester 25 hours; 5 hours per paper). During the remedial sessions, important and difficult topics were revised and the previous year university question papers were discussed. The remedial classes were arranged for slow learners and for other students based on their performance in the Class Tests, Internal Examination and University

Examinations. The remedial sessions were conducted 3 days a week, from 3:30 pm to 4:30 pm, especially on days closer to Internal Exams and University Examinations. Most of the students have utilized these classes in different courses for better understanding, revising important and complex topics and clarifying their doubts. All the faculty members are taken special care to improve the pass percentage of the slow learners. The overall remedial class student's attendance is 78% for academic year 2021-2022.

REPORT OF BRIDGE COURSES

The Department of History has been conducting Bridge Courses for the first-year undergraduate students for the last three years. The course is arranged to bridge the knowledge gap of students by linking Higher Secondary School Syllabi to the syllabi of Undergraduate courses at the entry level. It also aims to impart basic concepts of the discipline which do not form part of earlier programme. Students from different academic backgrounds opting for History at Undergraduate level benefit from this course as they are made familiar with history as a social science discipline, its methodology and important historical developments in a chronological manner. The students are introduced to a brief yet comprehensive summary of Ancient, Medieval and Modern World and Indian History in a simple and lucid manner. The course is designed with a Syllabus under a Department Coordinator and Head of the Department.

Commerce Association Inauguration




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The formal inauguration of the Commerce Association for the year 2021-2022 was held on 3rd September 2021 at 10 am through Google meet.



Report on National Consumer Day (Wake Up Consumer Wake Up)




Webinar on Career Guidance


Outcome

3. Interaction with Research Scholar



"Together Towards Life" is a Community Development Project jointly initiated by Anjappam Charitable Society and SCM Kerala in response to the Kerala floods in 2018. The present edition, TTL 2021- 2022, is partnered with the Department of Commerce, St. Thomas College to engage holistically in the life enrichment process of the local community in Ambalapara, near Ranny, Pathanamthitta district. The inhabitants of Ambalapara are basically landless people who have settled on

government revenue land. The majority among them are Dalits. The financial backwardness is intermingled with social and cultural factors. Due to these, they experience an 'invisibility' or'nonverbal' social exclusion and marginalisation. Such alienation has severely affected the perspectives and the motivation of the young minds as well as the elders. TTL 2021- 2022 has a specific focus on addressing the comprehensive development of the youth of Ambalapara. The inspiration for this initiative is the 86th amendment of the Constitution of India which guarantees the right to compulsory education to its citizens 1 between the age of 6 to 14. Many students in the abovementioned place are unable to fully utilise this birthright due to certain social, economical and cultural reasons. The broader aim of this initiative is to establish this fundamental right of the students. The project is accompanying the youth to inspire and equip themselves to develop:


- their attitude and approaches to life situations and possibilities;
- · their learning skills and academic life;
- their social and career skills;
- their commitment to the community and its development;
- their search for the meaning and beauty of life.

Along with the support to the youth and students of the community, TTL envisages supporting and enabling families struggling to have safe homes and hygienic sanitational facilities.


Toilet Construction 2: Mr. Kunjunju, aged 76, and his wife Ammini, aged 71, belong to a socially and financially backward family. They have two sons and a daughter who are living with their families. Along with their financial crises and old age issues, they were daily struggling without a proper toilet facility. They either used their neighbour's toilet which is away or their own premises. Realising the pathetic situation faced by Mr. Kunjunju, the TTL team decided to provide a toilet facility attached to their home which was an immediate and daily need of the parents. Understanding the Department's initiatives, the College Principal Dr. Roy K. George contributed rupees thirty thousand (Rs. 30,000.00) towards the toilet construction fund. The students and faculty members raised rupees six thousand six hundred and forty-three (Rs.6643.00) to complete the construction. The construction expense was rupees thirty-six thousand six hundred and fortythree only (Rs.36,643.00). The construction of the toilet started in the third week of January 2022. The new toilet is attached to the house easing the old parents. The total area of the toilet facility is 45 sq feet. The facility has a European closet and ample bath space. This is the second toilet constructed by the Department. The toilet construction was timely and huge support for the old age parents. 


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Condolence Meeting

Internal Quality Assurance Cell 2021-22

An Induction Programme for newly appointed teachers with less than 5 years of service in college was conducted at TMAM Orientation and Research Centre, Manganam, Kottayam, from 29th April 2022 to 1st May 2022. It was a three-day programme titled Changing Landscape of Higher Education in India. Day One of the Induction programme began with the inaugural ceremony in which Dr George K Alex, the IQAC Coordinator of the college, elaborated on the themes and objectives of the programme. Rt. Rev. Dr Abraham Mar Paulos Episcopa, the Manager of the Institution, expressed his apprehensions about NEP. The second session of Day 1 was taken by Dr Baby Sam Samuel, a business mentor and strategy consultant on Perspectives and Challenges to Qualitative Institutional Management. Dr Samuel discussed the importance of Applied Education, the opportunities that have come up in the post-pandemic era, and the teaching strategies to be undertaken for Generation Z. He concluded by describing the five important aspects of qualitative and effective education, which are: Reflect, Standardize, Adapt, Collaborate, and Innovate. It was a fruitful session for all the participants.

Day two of the Programme, 30 April 2022, began with a session on National Education Policy Challenges and Prospects' by the notable educationist and Professor of the School of Education in Central University, Kasaragod; it was an insightful and informative session that gave the participants a better understanding of the NEP 2020. The afternoon session included a group discussion where all participants were divided into three groups: Teaching, Learning and Evaluation, Administrative Initiatives and Strategic Planning. The participants were asked to brainstorm the challenges that will be faced by the institution with the inception of NEP 2020 and propose recommendations and solutions to mitigate such challenges to survive in the new competitive academic ecosystem. This was followed by a short session by Mr Reji Paul, Superintendent of Administration at St Thomas College Kozhencherry. He talked about documentation and service-related matters. The next session, from 3:30 PM to 5:30 PM, was on Theology and Philosophy of Education Today; Rev. Dr Mothy Varkey served as the moderator, and the resource persons for this session were Fr. Paul Thelakat and Dr M.P. Mathai. This was followed by a session on The Changing Landscape of Higher Education in India' by Dr Sujith Parayil, Associate Professor at the School of Social Sciences, M G University. Day three of the programme had a session by Dr M.S. John, Central University, Kasaragod on Quality Assessment in Higher Education: Institutional Level and Faculty Level. Dr John began by advising the participants on how the institution can prepare itself for the upcoming accreditation process by NAAC. The three-day Induction Programme 2022, titled 'Changing Landscape of Higher Education in India' was an academic experience for all the participants.
