COMMON COMPUTER FACILITY (CCF)

Common Computer Facility is a separate computer lab of St Thomas College Kozhencherry established in the year 2008 in order to impart computer literacy to all the students of the college. As the college is offering conventional courses at UG and PG levels, which are not covering any knowledge in computer field, the gap is normally filled by the CCF. CCF is providing compulsory training in the Basics of Computer to all students of the college. It provides computer facility to teachers for doing their research work, help desk for online registration of UG and PG admission and for online application for PSC, SSC, Railway, Banks, Navy, Army and Air force etc. CCF is used for doing the project work of UG and PG students, assists the internal examination of the college, provide reprographic facility to students and teachers.

CCF provides Basic Computer Literacy Course – BCLC (20 hrs theory and 10 hrs practicals). CCF is now assisted by Ms Jyothi and technical assistance by Mr Sunil Mathew.

In association with the District Collectorate and with their guidelines, the volunteers were assigned for cleaning flood-affected houses in Koipuram Panchayat near Kozhencherry. With the required materials from the District Collectorate the volunteers offered helping hand to 20 houses in Koippuram Colony. About 60 volunteers participated in the cleaning programme.



Flood Relief Cleaning at St Thomas School, Kozhencherry-22/8/2018



The school was almost drowned under water and was full of thick mud. About 100 students attended this cleaning work. They worked hard and removed all thick mud and cleaned every class room. All required materials needed for cleaning were given by school officials.

Flood Relief Chlorination at Aranmula-30/8/2018

REYONO JOURNAL OF INTERDISCIPLINARY STUDIES

A National Seminar on “Natural Disasters in Kerala: Concerns and Challenges” was organised by *REYONO journal of interdisciplinary studies* in association with the IQAC on 7 March 2019 to develop a platform for evolving disaster management techniques using modern technologies. This seminar was organized in response to the natural calamities like Tsunami 2004, Okhi 2017, and the Floods of 2018 that exposed the vulnerability of the State to natural disasters.



The First technical session on “Disaster Management System in Kerala” was led by Dr Sekhar Lukose Kuriakose (Member Secretary, Kerala State Disaster Management Authority). Second session “Floods in Kerala: A Challenge of Environmental Management” was led by Dr Srikumar Chattopadhyay (Scientist and Head, National Centre for Earth Science Studies,

Ministry of Earth Sciences, Govt. of India) and the final session on “Landslides and Land Subsidence in the Western Ghats of Kerala” was led by Dr G. Shankar (Former Scientist and Senior Consultant, National Centre for Earth Science Studies, Ministry of Earth Sciences, Govt. of India). All the sessions were followed by vibrant interaction. Technical session was followed by paper presentations on the thrust areas by scholars across Kerala. Dr Praveen S.S. and Ms Ann Susa Thomas convened the seminar.

SCHOLAR SUPPORT PROGRAMME

St Thomas College, Kozhencherry has been successfully organizing the Scholar Support Programme initiated by the Office of the New Initiatives, Department of Higher Education, Government of Kerala in the years 2014-15, 2015-16 and in 2016-17.
