

#### ARTS FESTIVAL 'HARSHAM'





#### CONCETTO VIRTUAL TALENT FESTIVAL






#### INTERNAL COMPLAINTS COMMITTEE


#### 1. Webinar on "Online Resources & Skill Development"

The Massive Open Online Committee of ST Thomas College Kozhencherry in association with Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) organized a webinar on 9 October 2020. The theme of the webinar was "Online Resources & Skill Development." The Webinar was inaugurated by Dr Mathew P. John, Principal, St Thomas College Kozhencherry and the resource person was Dr K. Satheesh Kumar, Associate Professor & Head, Department of Future Studies, University of Kerala, Thiruvananthapuram. Dr Praveen S.S. delivered the welcome address.

During the technical session Dr K Satheesh Kumar explained about the importance of online resources for teaching and learning during the Covid-19 pandemic days. He mentioned that students across the world are losing valuable time due to the lockdown imposed. But there are numerous online learning opportunities which they can access from their homes, thereby making good use of this lockdown period for their skill enhancement. He explained some of the major online learning resources and its details.

After the main talk an interactive session was held. Participants asked many questions about various online learning platforms and their accessibility. Ms. Priya Mathews proposed the vote of thanks. Online certificates were provided for all the participants. 131 participants actively participated in the webinar.





#### 2. MOOCs in collaboration with COURSERA

Coursera is the one among the world's premier online learning platform. It brings educational contents from best universities and industries in an easy-to-use online platform. St Thomas College Kozhencherry in collaboration with COURSERA CAMPUS RESPONSE INITIATIVE, provided enrolled students access to more than 3,800 courses, 400 specializations and 270 guided projects from different universities and industry partners. Enrolled students got free access to their courses from 15/07/2020to 30/11/2020 to complete their courses. The students, faculty members and alumni of St Thomas College Kozhencherry used this golden opportunity. There are 2000 course enrollments from 729 learners. Most of the enrolled learners successfully completed their courses.

#### MOOC ON ORGANIC FARMING

The Massive Open Online Course (MOOC) on Organic Farming is a novel programme introduced by Mahatma Gandhi University in accordance with the social initiative of The Government of Kerala to transform Kerala into a self-reliant and eco-friendly state under its 'Haritha Keralam' Mission. It aims to make our society self-sufficient with regards to the production of 'safe to eat vegetables and fruits' and to help develop a positive attitude among students towards organic farming and sustainable agricultural practices.

MOOC on Organic Framing has been introduced by the University from academic year 2020-21 for all DC 1 students as an added credit course. Its primary focus is to educate our students in the life-skill of environment-friendly farming techniques by cultivating organic, healthy and nutritious food at home.

As per the directive of the University, all the DC 1 students of 2020-2023 batch were enrolled into the MOOC on Organic Farming programme. A total of 423 students registered. It was also notified that there had to be a college level Coordinator and a Mentor for each Department from every college for the implementation of the course. A training programme was conducted by the



University for all the Coordinators from the colleges affiliated to the University. These training videos were then shared by the Coordinator to the Mentors.



1. Inauguration of Multidisciplinary Research Centre (MRC) St Thomas College, Kozhencherry was held on 24 February 2021. Prof. Dr. Achuthsankar S. Nair, Head of the Department of Computational Biology and Bioinformatics, State Inter-University Centre of Excellence in Bioinformatics (SIUCEB) University of Kerala, Karyavattom in his inaugural address mentioned about the importance of new knowledge in a progressive society to make us better human beings. There are significant differences in research in fields like science, humanities and arts, scientific principles etc. There is a need to develop mutual respect. In a simple lucid style Nair briefly explained about how to do research. While doing research one need to observe, ask and debate and find answers to your questions. Research skills involve creative thinking and critical thinking.



Creative thinking is divergent where as critical thinking mainly focuses on convergent thinking. The session was very interesting and was highly interactive.



**2.** Multidisciplinary Research Centre (MRC) St Thomas College, Kozhencherry organized a talk on **Opportunities for Scientific Research** by Dr. Sarika A. R., Scientist, KSCSTE, Kerala on 10 March 2021. Dr Sarika A.R. gave an inspiring talk on how to choose a career path, funding opportunities etc. She explained what career is and how to chose a career. Proper decision making, systematic exploration, guidance, finance etc. can play important roles in choosing one's career. In the 21<sup>st</sup> century, one need to update knowledge. Workforce has been changing and therefore one need to change according to requirement. She explained 'IKIGAI' a Japanese concept, meaning 'a reason for being' which includes mission, vision, vocation and passion. Self-introspection becomes very essential and one should identify his or her goals. There is a need for individual to be open minded. She further explained various funding opportunities for research and higher education.


#### 2. International Yoga Day Celebration (21/06/2020)


#### 6. NCC Day Celebration (23/11/2020)

National Service Scheme (NSS) is a public service programme for youth under the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India. 'Education through Service' is the purpose of NSS. The ideological orientation of NSS is inspired by the ideals of Mahatma Gandhi. Its motto is "Not Me But You." The NSS Unit of St. Thomas College, Kozhencherry is active in identifying the social problems in the locality, adopting a strategy, and lending a helping hand to tackle them.

#### 1. A Helping Hand:

During the lockdown due to the Covid-19 pandemic, when the classes were suddenly shifted to online mode of learning, some students of the college lacked access to smartphones for online classes. NSS volunteers raised a fund and provided smartphones for the students in need.



#### 2. Women's Equality Day:

Women's Equality Day was observed on August 26<sup>th</sup> to commemorate the adoption of the Nineteenth Amendment to the United States Constitution, granting women the right to vote. An Online Quiz Competition was conducted and e-certificates were distributed.

#### 3. Teacher's Day:

In India, 5<sup>th</sup> September is celebrated as Teacher's Day as a mark of tribute to the contribution made by teachers to the society. A Teacher's Day greeting video was made by the volunteers for our teachers.

### 4. World Suicide Prevention Day:

World Suicide Prevention Day is an awareness day observed on 10<sup>th</sup> September every year, in order to provide worldwide commitment and action to prevent suicides. An online meeting was conducted via Google Meet and a candle was lit by every volunteer in the dark which symbolized the ray of hope in all odds. An awareness video was also created.

#### 5. NSS Day:

NSS was formally launched on 24<sup>th</sup> September, 1969, the birth centenary year of the Father of the Nation. Therefore, 24<sup>th</sup> September is celebrated every year as NSS Day. It is high time to protect Mother Nature. So, this year, environment-friendly programmes were conducted by our NSS unit on NSS Day. A planting challenge was created which was an ideal approach to support nature. Use of paper bags helps in conserving huge amounts of energy and can be reused and therefore generates no pollution. An online training on paper bag making was also conducted after which each volunteer was asked to make 5-10 paper bags which were distributed later.

#### 6. Gandhi Jayanthi:

On October 2, on the occasion of Gandhi Jayanthi, the Unit launched 'Reminiscing the Mahatma' as a part of which drawing, craft and poetry writing competitions were held and prizes were distributed to the winners.

#### 7. World Postal Day:

World Postal Day is celebrated on 9 October to raise awareness among people about the role of postal sector for people and business every day. A letter writing competition was conducted and the winners received certificates. The most touching letter, that also won the first prize, was one that was written to Corona by one of our teachers, who was covid positive.

#### 8. Kerala Piravi:

'Kerala Piravi' marks the birth of the State of Kerala on 1 November. Our state Kerala is
largely dependent on agriculture and has its own traditional agricultural practices. The life of the
people and agriculture were interwoven. But now, most of the vegetables that we use in our houses
everyday are imported from other states. To promote agricultural practices among students and to

#### 10. Children's Day:

Children's Day is celebrated across India to increase awareness of the rights, care and education of children. It is celebrated on 14 November every year as a tribute to the first Prime Minister of India, Jawaharlal Nehru.\_A Caption Writing Competition was conducted on the occasion and prizes were distributed.

#### 11. National Youth Day:

Swami Vivekandha was one of India's most iconic and influential spiritual personalities. India celebrates his birthday,12<sup>th</sup> January as National Youth Day. An Online Discussion session was conducted through Google Meet where the ideas of Swami Vivekandha were discussed. A video was also made which marked his life and message.

#### 12. **Blood Donors Directory**:

Blood is the most precious gift that a person can give another person, the Gift of Life. NSS volunteers made an effort to find donors among the volunteers and the alumni and made a Blood Donors Directory. This helps to ensure that there is no delay in supplying blood when the need arises. We are able to lend timely help as and when required.

#### 13. <u>SMRITHI – 7 Day Virtual Camp</u>:

'SMRITHI' - Virtual seven-day camp of the NSS unit was conducted from 22<sup>nd</sup> to 28<sup>th</sup> January 2021. The theme of the camp was 'Youth For Prevention and Mitigation Of Covid -19'. Various activities were conducted which generated an awareness about the pandemic as well as activities which help tackle the pandemic situation.

The camp was inaugurated on 22<sup>nd</sup> January by Dr. M. S. Sunil who is a renowned social worker and philanthropist. Dr. Mathew P. John, the Principal, along with the Programme Officers Mr. Laby Cherian Punnoose and Ms. Susan George welcomed the honourable guest. The Programme Officers, along with the volunteer secretaries Vimal Paul and Sneha S., introduced the motives of the camp and gave necessary instructions as well. First year volunteers were grouped to facilitate efficient communication among them and to make them understand the importance of group work. Second year volunteers guided them in their group activities. It enabled them to know about how to behave or interact and conduct a program successfully as a group. It also helped to build healthy relationships as well as team spirit in them. Each day started with a yoga session in the morning followed by the report presentation of the previous day and ended with interactive and ice breaking sessions. Cultural sessions were also conducted.

Class on different topics were conducted every day from Day 2 onwards:

• 'Organic Vegetable Farming' by Dr. Rincy K. Abraham (Krishi Vigyan Kendra) helped the students to understand the need for a kitchen garden and to develop the habit of cultivating organic vegetables in their homes rather than depending on the market.



- Dr. Sindhu R. S., Head of the Department of Physical Education shared her views and knowledge about healthy aging in her talk on 'Healthy Aging' which created an awareness about developing and maintaining the functional ability that enables wellbeing in older age.
- 'Edapt-Educating oneself for the changing world' by Rini Eliza Anien, ASAP Trainer, discussed about why and how we should prepare ourselves for the changing world.
- Guidance class by Mr. Arun John, former Programme Officer of NSS Unit, enlightened the volunteers about the motives and vision of NSS.
- 'Self-awareness' by Dr. Nelson P Abraham, former faculty of the Department of Zoology emphasized on how to understand our strengths as well as weaknesses and the need for self-introspection.

As it was a pandemic situation, the volunteers were advised to work in their locality. They were given activities every day involved their contribution in the society and environment like making and distribution of masks, making paper bags which emphasized the need of switching to eco-friendly methods, setting up a medicinal garden, conducting a survey in their locality about issues related to Covid which enabled them to know their locality better and making a compost pit in their yard to segregate biodegradable wastes and to utilize them effectively. On Republic Day, 26<sup>th</sup> January, a video was made by the volunteers and the National Anthem was sung during the morning assembly.

The camp concluded with a valedictory ceremony on the last day. An overall analysis of the camp was done by the Programme Officers. The volunteers came to understand the needs and aims of the seven-day camp and the values of cooperation, team effort and social service. They narrated their experiences about the camp and the values they got from interaction with society. Though it was a virtual camp, volunteers actively took part in it amidst the limitations.

#### 14. World Radio Day:

February 13<sup>th</sup> is celebrated as World Radio Day to raise awareness among the public about the importance of radio. In these modern times where the importance of radio is forgotten, the NSS team launched a radio programme 'Love FM 72.5 – Let's Hear the Voice Of Diversity' on the official YouTube channel and Instagram page.

#### 15. National Road Safety Awareness Month:

As part of National Road Safety Month from 18<sup>th</sup> January to 17<sup>th</sup> February 2021, a video was made raising awareness about traffic rules and signs. The theme of this year was "Sadak Suraksha- Jeevan Raksha." The volunteers also undertook the cleaning of the Aranmula Traffic Park.

#### 16. College Campus Beautification:

As students are away from college during the lockdown, our NSS volunteers cleaned various parts of the campus and made necessary arrangements to beautify it. Two ponds of our college were cleaned and rehabilitated on River Protection Day.

#### 17. World Consumer Rights Day:

With the aim to raise global awareness about consumer rights and needs, World Consumer Rights Day is observed every year on March 15. The theme for this year was 'Tackling Plastic Pollution'. Our unit undertook a fund-raising initiative to provide financial support to Sabari Balika Sadanam in Konni to help them support the kids there.






#### 22. Angamuzhi Project:

#### 23. World Cancer Day:



#### STUDENT'S GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL

An eight-member committee with the Principal Dr Mathew P. John as Chairman and Dr Elizabeth John as the Convenor constituted the Student's Grievance Redressal Committee of the academic year. The other members on the Committee were Dr Susan Mathew, Dr Saramma Varghese, Mr. Suresh Mathew George (Staff Council Secretary), Dr Jaison Jose and two student representatives, Thejus K. Biju of II M.A. English and Dhanya Raj of II M. Sc Physics.

The Committee met on 16 November 2020 to discuss its objectives and the procedures whereby grievances of students could be solved. The Cell would examine the issues and the complaints raised by the students in respect of matters like admission, harassment, victimization, unfriendly treatment or any other grievance which annoy the student in any way. It would provide opportunities to redress their grievances. 
#### UNITED NATIONS ACADEMIC IMPACT-ASPIRE CHAPTER



#### 5. 'SCIENTIA'- Quiz Competition on National Science Day






#### **Activities**


# **WOMEN'S HOSTEL**



#### 1. Talk on Mental Wellness, Counseling Support and Personal Care


