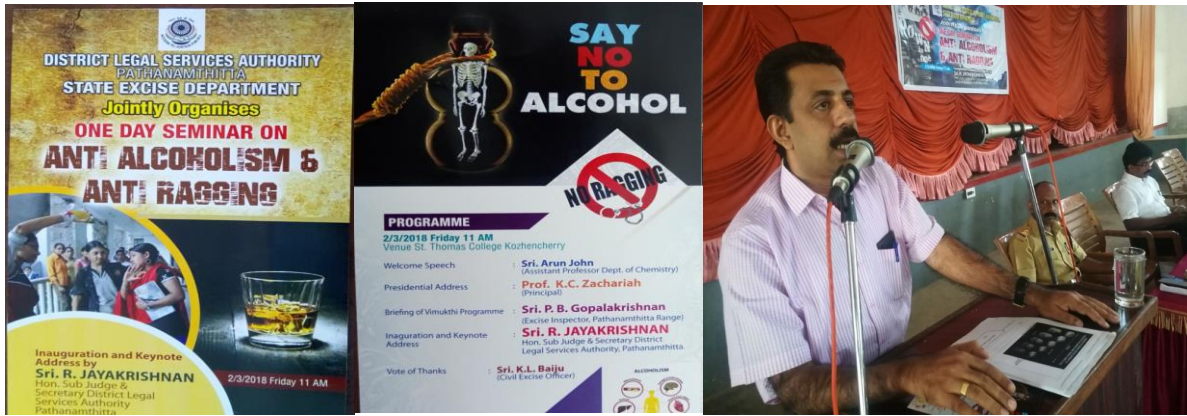

ANTI-DRUG CELL

The anti-drug cell of the college has been constituted to ensure a drug free campus by imposing a total ban on consumption of drugs and alcohol by students within or outside the campus. Principal, Prof. K. C. Zachariah serves as the chairman and all HoDs, NSS and NCC Officers are the members of this committee. The Kerala Excise Department launched a programme called “Vimukthi 2017” to give awareness to the youth and society about the ill effects of drugs. A seminar on problems related to drug abuse and its legal and health consequences was conducted in collaboration with the District Legal Society and State Excise Department. Sri R. Jayakrishnan, Honorable Sub Judge, Secretary of District Legal Authority, took a class on the legal problems of drug use and drug delivery in educational institutions and the society. Sri. P. B. Gopalakrishnan, Pathanamthitta Excise Circle Inspector, took classes on the social and health problems of drug abuse.



Anti-Drug Cell conducted a poster designing competition in cooperation with the NSS on 24 June 2017. The topic was “Youth and Drug Addiction.”

The forum initiated and organized “Reading the Editorial,” a novel programme for the undergraduate and the postgraduate students in collaboration with senior PG English students. It was a programme which zeroed in on instilling and developing the skills in English of undergraduate and postgraduate students. On Wednesday noon intervals, after informing interested students to gather at the Dr Juhanon Mar Thoma Hall (Media Centre) in advance, the forum discussed an editorial of ‘The Hindu’ which was often picked by students themselves. Initially the Coordinator read an editorial, often one of the two terse but dense

editorials on the left hand side of the editorial page of “The Hindu,” hinting the meanings of difficult words, phrases and usages, and later discussing the topic itself. Eventually the senior PG English students took turns to read and discuss the editorial. PG and UG Students from various departments attended and actively participated in the sessions. The programme had a seminal impact on fine-tuning the English of students. It also helped them understand complex issues, contemporary and concerning humanity at present, and mediate/communicate them in suitable epigrammatic modes of expressions in English. The journalistic interpretation of current news was also a beneficial aspect of learning for participant students.
