



"DHWANI" was inaugurated by the respected Principal of the college Dr. Roy George K on 24th December,2021 4:00 pm via Google Meet. The seven day camp was flagged off by singing the NSS Theme song. The welcome speech and camp introduction were delivered by the Volunteer Secretaries Parvathy P H and Bobin Babu Mathew. Programme Officers Prof. Susan George gave the Presidential address and Prof. Laby Cheriyan Ponnoose delivered the felicitation.

At 7.00 pm, volunteers were given instructions regarding conducting of the camp, formation of groups, time schedules and programmes to be conducted on each day.

The camp was conducted online on 25th and 26th of December. Starting from 7.00 am senior volunteer Amalendhu led the yoga session till 8.00 am. Assembly was conducted from 8.00 to 8.30 am. Volunteers were grouped into seven groups and were assigned to do work each day. Each day the respective groups conducted assemblies and the assigned work for seven days. Each assembly consisted of NSS song, report, thought for the day, and news. The work session was from 10 to 12 noon. The class session was conducted after the work session in the afternoon. The cultural session was conducted at night from 7.00 -9.00 pm.

On 25th volunteers made cotton carry bags raising awareness against plastic pollution. The class session was led by former volunteer secretary Abin

George Mathew who explained the history of NSS and his experience in NSS. He gave volunteers clear guidance about NSS and it was a fun experience for all. On 26th volunteers made paper pens and promoted the use of eco-friendly gadgets. The class session was taken by Adv. Uzhavoor Sasi who practices in Mumbai High Court. He took a class on the topic "Rights of Children and Rehabilitation of Broken Family". On both days the cultural session was conducted by respective volunteer groups through an online platform and was concluded with a camp review of each day.

On 27th December offline camp was started and by 9.30 all volunteers were present at the college. On the first day of offline camp, volunteers cleaned the college surroundings during the work session. In the afternoon two classes were conducted. The first class was by V R Vimal Raj sir who talked about kathakali and its heritage and lasted one hour from 1.30 to 2.30 pm. The second class was led by former NSS programme officer, Arun John. He engaged volunteers with various character development games and interactive talks. Later in the evening, group 3 performed the cultural events which concluded by 9.00 pm and lights were put off by 10.00 pm.

On 28th yoga session started at 6.30am and ended by 7.00am and after that group 4 conducted the assembly. From 8.30am to 12.30pm volunteers were given vegetable seeds and were asked to plant it to make a vegetable orchard. At 1.30pm the executive director of Dhisha pathanamthitta, Shan Ramesh Gopan took the class session and talked to the volunteers about gender neutrality and engaged them in games. And at 6.pm cultural events were conducted which were concluded by 9.00pm and by 10.00pm lights were put off.

On 29th yoga session started at 6.30am and assembly was concluded by 7.30am. Volunteers were given an indoor project from 8.30am to 12.30pm to develop their ideas and present them in a student-friendly and modern-age educational institution. Later at 1.30 pm Dr. Neena Suresh came to take the class session on the topic "Happiness", it concluded by 3.00pm. cultural events started at 6.30pm and concluded by 9.00pm and by 10.00pm lights were turned off.

On the last day of the camp, the yoga session started at 6.30 am and was concluded by an assembly at 7.15 am. at 8.30 camp was concluded and camp reviews were delivered by the programme officers Laby Cheriyan Ponnoose and Susan George. The camp experience was shared by junior volunteer Megha J, volunteer secretary Parvathy P H, and discipline ceo Blesson Mathew. The college principal Roy George K sir came to give his wishes to the volunteers on their successful participation in the camp. Thus, the seven-day camp "DHWANI20211" was concluded on 30th December by 11.00 am.


"Together Towards Life" is a Community Development Project jointly initiated by Anjappam Charitable Society and SCM Kerala in response to the Kerala floods in 2018. The present edition, TTL 2021- 2022, is partnered with the Department of Commerce, St. Thomas College to engage holistically in the life enrichment process of the local community in Ambalapara, near Ranny, Pathanamthitta district. The inhabitants of Ambalapara are basically landless people who have settled on government revenue land. The majority among them are Dalits. The financial backwardness is intermingled with social and cultural factors. Due to these, they experience an 'invisibility' or 'non-verbal' social exclusion and marginalisation. Such alienation has severely affected the perspectives and the motivation of the young minds as well as the elders. TTL 2021- 2022 has a specific focus on addressing the comprehensive development of the youth of Ambalapara. The inspiration for this initiative is the 86th amendment of the Constitution of India which guarantees the right to compulsory education to its citizens 1 between the age of 6 to 14. Many students in the above-mentioned place are unable to fully utilise this birthright due to certain social, economical and cultural reasons. The broader aim of this initiative is to establish this fundamental right of the students. The project is accompanying the youth to inspire and equip themselves to develop:

- a. their attitude and approaches to life situations and possibilities;
- b. their learning skills and academic life;
- c. their social and career skills;
- d. their commitment to the community and its development;
- e. their search for the meaning and beauty of life.

Along with the support to the youth and students of the community, TTL envisages supporting and enabling families struggling to have safe homes and hygienic sanitational facilities.

Toilet Construction 2: Mr. Kunjunju, aged 76, and his wife Ammini, aged 71, belong to a socially and financially backward family. They have two sons and a daughter who are living with their families. Along with their financial crises and old age issues, they were daily struggling without a proper toilet facility. They either used their neighbour's toilet which is away or their own premises.

Realising the pathetic situation faced by Mr. Kunjunju, the TTL team decided to provide a toilet facility attached to their home which was an immediate and daily need of the parents. The construction expenses for the toilet was rupees thirty-six thousand six hundred and forty-three only (Rs.36,643.00). The construction of the toilet started in the third week of January 2022. The new toilet is attached to the house easing the old parents. The total area of the toilet facility is 45 sq feet. The facility has a European closet and ample bath space. This is the second toilet constructed by the Department. The toilet construction was timely and huge support for the old age parents. Now they can avoid an open area or neighbour's toilet, thus enabling their old age with ease and



35. TOGETHER TOWARDS LIFE: A LIFE ENRICHMENT TRAINING PROGRAMMES:

Then, Dr. Leena K Cherian, Co-ordinator of the programme & Assistant Professor, Department of Commerce, delivered the Welcome speech and cordially welcomed the gathering. The programme aims to instill the idea of social welfare in students and works to ensure that everyone who is needy gets help to enhance their standard of living and lead a life of dignity.

The programme was then followed by a Christmas Carol song by the students of Commerce Department Ms. Reshma Elsa John, Ms. Tessy Thankachen and team.

The meeting was presided over by the Principal of the College, Dr. Roy George K. who highlighted the significance of social responsibility of every individual. He appreciated the efforts of the department with great rejoice. After the Principal's speech, a melodious song was sung by Ms. Nissy P Babu. This was followed by an enlightening and encouraging speech by the Chief guest of the programme, Rev. Fr. Biju A S, an ardent mentor of the natives of Ambalapara, who had delivered a valuable and motivating speech about the role of youth on social welfare. The representatives of Kerala SCM and Anjappam, Mr. Lovewin Cherian, Mr. Christy Mathew John were also present as the special guests of the programme.

The students from Ambalapara, Ms. Arya Manoj, Aksa and Anupama showed their talent in front of the audience by presenting a beautiful group dance performance. The programme was then followed by the introduction of all the students present in the session. The introduction session was followed by a Quiz competition organised by final year PG students Ms. Aiswarya, Reshma and Betcy. The students were divided into four teams. The quiz session was filled with information which included questions from different areas like current affairs, general knowledge, business, sports, literature, commerce etc. The students actively participated in this Quiz competition which enlightened them with more knowledge.

After that, a Paper craft work class was held by Ms. Sruthy R Nath of first year PG. The students were trained on making paper baskets and they got a chance to clarify doubts they had in this matter. After the class, the students were well

aware on how to make paper baskets. This was followed by an interactive and interesting Game session to entertain the students and all of them played well with good team spirit.

After that, Prize distribution was done by Mr. Justin Thomas Philip, Coordinator of the programme & Assistant Professor, Department of Commerce. He distributed the prizes among the participants as a token of appreciation and also handed over the gifts and study materials collected from the entire students of the Commerce Department for the students of Ambalapara village. This was followed by a Campus tour to introduce and guide the visitors to familiarize them with Kozhencherry St. Thomas College campus including College Library, Solar panel power project of Commerce Department etc,. The campus visit was very much informative and fruitful for the students not only for their academic performance but also for enriching their awareness about the legacy of the College.

By about 5:00 PM, the programme came to an end with the Vote of thanks proposed by Convenor, Mrs. Ria Mammen, Assistant Professor, Department of Commerce.

There was great enthusiasm among the students and they were looking highly spirited throughout the session. The students were served light refreshment. Feedback from the students reads that they are satisfied and demanding more such visits. They also attested that it was their first experience in this manner so far. The main outcome was to enhance the skills and knowledge content of the students and to provide them with a unique and best experience.

The Commerce Department has consistently interacted with the society, especially to make awareness about social responsibility for solving the problems of weaker sections of the society and to inculcate social commitment for the cause of value based higher education, community building and universal brotherhood. About 15 enthusiastic student volunteers co-operated with the programme by providing help and instructions for the visitors and in giving assistance to the organizing team. All the Faculty and students of the Commerce Department put in their best to make the programme a grand success.

36. <u>KARSHAKAMITHRA-COMMUNITY EXTENSION PROGRAMME (15TH JULY 2021)</u>

The Post Graduate and Research Department of Botany, St. Thomas College, Kozhencherry has been consistently interacted with the society, especially to make awareness about the scientific knowledge for solving the problems of farmers and weaker sections of the society. On 15th of July 2021, 'Karshakamithra' an extension activity, jointly organized by under department of Botany and Central Integrated Pest Management Centre (CIPMC), Ernakulam offered services and activities for the benefit of the famers residing in Kozhencherry Panchayat. CIPMC, Ernakulam is a wing under Directorate of Plant Protection, Quarantine & Storage) Department of Agriculture, Cooperation & Farmers Welfare, Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare, Government of India. Due to Covid '19 pandemic protocol of govt. of Kerala, only 15 pre-registered farmers were allowed to participate in the program.

TECHNICAL SESSION - I: "Integrated Pest Management" by Mr. Milu Mathews, Plant Protection Officer, CIPMC, Ernakulam.

The first technical session was led by Mr. Milu Mathews, Plant Protection Officer, CIPMC, Ernakulam, Govt. of India, in which the facts, figures and the milestones in the IPM were discussed. He focused on the importance of friendly pests like *Trichogramma*, pest traps etc in the agriculture fields. He stated that the concentration of population in urban areas and change in consumption behavior had led to enormous increase in use of pesticides and fertilizers. He also discussed the possible strategies and framework required towards IPM. Mr. Milu Mathews, further cited of good practices, successful examples and other mechanisms in the nation and other countries towards IPM strategies. He discussed the view that the risks of anthropogenic activities impose practical responsibilities, some of which are prudential and some of which are ethical. He claimed that while these views are plausible, they would require revising our conceptions of moral and political responsibility. He also suggested that in addition to whatever duties are generated by these responsibilities, another duty-respect for nature-also seems engaged by the risk of pesticide pollution. After the presentation, there were many participants who had queries on IPM.

TECHNICAL SESSION - II: Effects of Herbicides and Pesticides Use

The second session was on the problems caused by overuse of herbicides and pesticides in Agriculture sector by Mr. Tom Cherian, Asst. Plant Protection Officer, CIPMC, Ernakulam. Pesticides are used to kill the pests and insects which attack on crops and harm them. Different kinds of pesticides have been used for crop protection for centuries. Excessive use of pesticides may lead to the destruction of biodiversity. Many birds, aquatic organisms and animals are

under the threat of harmful pesticides for their survival. Pesticides are a concern for sustainability of environment and global stability.

Exhibition of IPM Materials

A small exhibition was also conducted by the CIPMC team to the farmers. It included different kinds of pest traps, handbooks on agriculture, eggs of *Trichogramma* fly, different pests and their stages, *Pseudomonas, Trichoderma*, sprayers, gum boots etc. Certificates were distributed to participating farmers by Dr. Leena Abraham (HoD of Botany, St. Thomas College, Kozhecherry). Handbooks on agriculture, eggs of Trichogramma, sprayers, gum 3 boots etc. were also distributed to farmers at free of cost. The program was concluded with a discussion with the participants followed by a vote of thanks delivered Ms. Adheena Elza Johns, Asst. Professor, Dept. of Botany.
















37. VEGETOS - 2022:
